The film explores the close links between the Reichstag building and the highs and lows of German parliamentary history.


Beginning with the imperial period at the end of the nineteenth century, the film will take you on a journey that touches on the development of parliamentarianism during the Weimar era, includes Germany's darkest hours after the Nazis took power and examines the decades when Germany was divided and reunification, taking you right up to the present day.

The film shows the construction, destruction, repair, wrapping and reconstruction of the Reichstag building and its final reincarnation at the end of the 1990s as the seat of the parliament of reunified Germany.

This journey through the past 130 years shows that the way in which the Reichstag building is used has always been a reflection of the state of German democracy.
