The German Bundestag invites you to spend four weeks in Berlin in the autumn of 2015.

The programme is intended for talented Arab people who are interested in politics and who are keen to play an active role in promoting core democratic values in their home countries.

The German Bundestag is offering you the opportunity to gain first-hand experience of the German parliamentary system and political decision-making processes during an intensive four-week programme at the German Bundestag.

Successful candidates will be chosen by the German Bundestag's independent selection panel.

The scholarship

Participants will receive a monthly scholarship of 450 euros. In addition, accommodation in an apartment complex will be provided free of charge, and the costs of travel to and from Berlin will be covered, as well as the costs of health, accident and personal liability insurance.

- Citizenship of an Arab country
- Under the age of 35 at the start of the scholarship
- University degree
- Very good knowledge of German
- An interest in politics and social/political commitment
