On Sunday, 6 September 2015, the German Bundestag will open its doors to the public for the 12th time when it welcomes visitors to its Open Day. I warmly invite you to join us once again this year to learn more about the German Bundestag and its wide-ranging role and explore some of its many places of work: the Reichstag, the Paul Löbe Building and the Marie-Elisabeth Lüders Building.

As the title of our Open Day – Insights and Outlooks – suggests, we are throwing open the doors so that you can look behind the scenes, gaining insights into places which you have perhaps only ever seen on television or were unable to visit last time, while enjoying some of the outlooks generally open only to Members of the Bundestag and their staff. Map of the German Bundestag's buildings

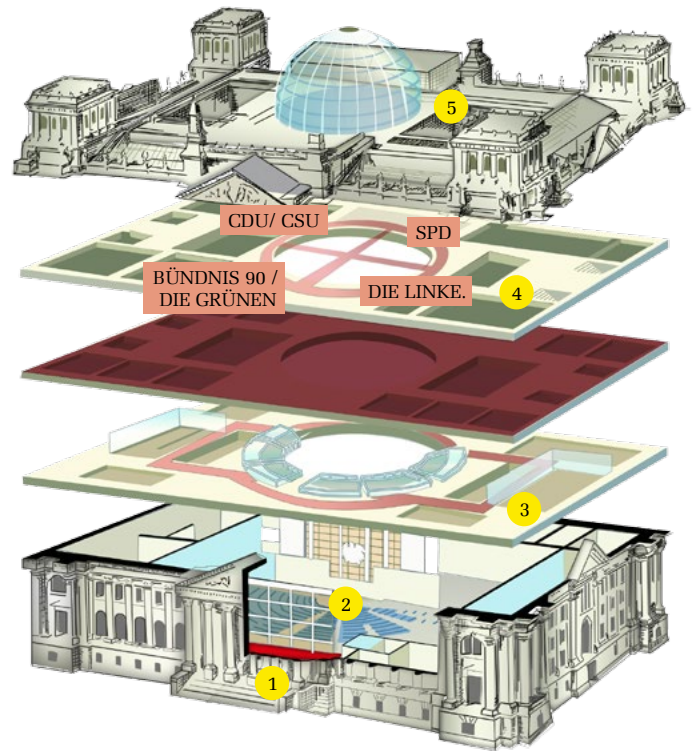

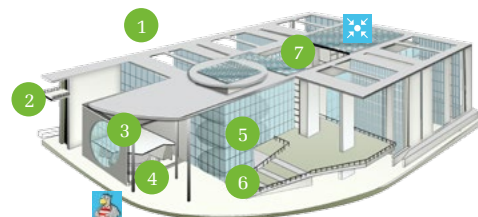
